MOTION FOR GLOBAL INJUNCTIVE RELIEF & JURISDICTIONAL PROTECTION
HEARING: COURTROOM 4, 13TH JUNE 2025, BEFORE JUSTICE RENE WILLIAMS

MAY IT PLEASE THE COURT:

The Claimant, Mr. Alkiviades David, respectfully moves this Honourable Court for immediate and extraordinary protective relief to preserve the integrity of these proceedings and the sovereignty of the jurisdiction of Antigua and Barbuda. The facts presented before this Court demonstrate, beyond credible doubt, the existence of a transnational criminal conspiracy involving legal professionals, media conglomerates, private intelligence networks, and hostile foreign actors.

This conspiracy is not speculative—it has resulted in the targeted killings of legal counsel including Mark Lieberman (Texas, 2024), Barry K. Rothman (California), John Quirk, and FCC strategist Rebecca Rini. These deaths are not isolated, but part of a coordinated effort to silence, destabilize, and eliminate key witnesses and advocates working to expose the media syndicate operating above the law.

At the center of this enterprise is Defendant David Boies, whose career has included the legitimization of platforms like Napster, the proliferation of copyright abuse, and—according to whistleblower testimony and federal filings—the concealment of trafficking networks facilitated through LimeWire and other tools. Despite a permanent ban issued by Judge Kimba Wood, the LimeWire platform has re-emerged, operating with the same network architecture, in flagrant contempt of U.S. federal court orders.

The Claimant has suffered sustained economic sabotage through the suppression of Hologram USA, FilmOn, and SwissX—a humanitarian corporation registered in Antigua. Despite this, the Claimant prevailed in multiple lawsuits against CBS Interactive, NBCUniversal, and Fox Television, securing both financial settlements and licensing deals, including a \$450,000 licensing payment from Universal Studios in 2025.

The Defendants have retaliated by launching fraudulent sexual misconduct claims, widely publicized in U.S. media, timed to coincide with strategic business expansions in Antigua. These claims are fabricated by known agents of the media cartel—Gloria Allred, Lisa Bloom, and David Boies—all of whom have a long-standing professional history with CBS, NBC, and FOX.

This Honourable Court is therefore urged to:

Grant a global stay on all litigation, arbitration, or regulatory proceedings involving the Claimant outside this jurisdiction;

Issue a protective declaration affirming Antigua and Barbuda as the sole and proper forum for these matters;

Order international and local enforcement support, including subpoena powers and inter-governmental notice to halt duplicative or retaliatory proceedings;

Acknowledge the deaths of legal counsel as grounds for heightened protective measures and judicial urgency.

This motion is supported by a comprehensive Position Statement, a Proposed Protective Order, and verifiable evidence of wrongdoing, including forensic, documentary, and testimonial support. The Claimant invites this Court to lead the region—and indeed the common law world—by asserting that sovereignty, dignity, and justice are not commodities to be bought, silenced, or erased by foreign billionaires and intelligence proxies.
